Marie Curie (1867-1934) was the first woman to win a Nobel Prize, the first person and the only woman to win the Nobel Prize twice, and the only person to win the Nobel Prize in two scientific fields. Curie coined the term "radioactivity" and discovered the elements polonium and radium. Under her direction, the world's first studies were conducted into the treatment of neoplasms using radioactive isotopes.
